



DISCRETIONARY GRANTS 1st FUNDING WINDOW 2019/2020 FINANCIAL YEAR

The Safety and Security Sector Education and Training Authority (SASSETA) invites member employers, public training institutes including public TVET colleges, NGO's, CBO's and Trade Unions operating in the safety and security sector as well as Unemployed Youth studying at public institutions towards the scarce and critical skills in the Safety and Security Sector to submit applications for Discretionary Grants for the 1st funding window of 2019/2020 financial year. Private sector employers must be registered under SASSETA, paying levies to SASSETA or exempt from levies and must have submitted their Workplace Skills Plan/ Pivotal Training Plan to SASSETA.

The learning programmes applied for must be in compliance with the lists as tabulated below. It is compulsory that all applicants comply with the new SASSETA Discretionary Grant Policy when applying.

Incomplete (no material information provided) and late applications would be summarily disqualified without recourse.

Should an applicant not receive correspondence from SASSETA within three months of submitting the application, they must accept that their application has been unsuccessful.

All applications must reach SASSETA on or before 14 January 2019 at 12:00 noon.


Applications must be placed in an envelope and marked as follows:

- DISCRETIONARY GRANT 2019/2020 First (1st) Funding Window.
- The envelope should specify the name of the LEARNING PROGRAM under which the application is being made.

It is compulsory that all applicants' complete **ONE** application form per project applied for. It is also compulsory that the following documents are included in **EACH** application. The certified stamp on the copies must not be older than **THREE** months.

MEMBER EMPLOYERS, PUBLIC TRAINING INSTITUTES, INCLUDING PUBLIC TVET COLLEGES, NGO's, CBO's, and TRADE UNIONS:

1. Company registrations documents
2. Skills Development Levy Number/Proof of registration for levies under SETA 19/Proof of Exemption
3. Valid PSIRA registration (applicable only to the Private Security Sub Sector applicants) or Law Society registration (applicable only to the Legal Sub Sector applicants) or relevant other professional Body Registration documents
4. Valid COID Certificate or relevant insurance for any employer who are applying to take on unemployed learners.
5. Valid Original Tax Clearance Certificate/ Certificate of Good Standing issued by SARS (Original only, no copies will be accepted)
6. A detailed budget clearly stipulating the breakdown cost of training per line item to be completed on the application form
7. In order to obtain discretionary grant funding for PIVOTAL programmes under this advertisement, a legal person falling into categories set out in sub-regulation (10) must complete and submit a PIVOTAL training plan and report using the template attached to the Funding Grant Regulations no. 35940 of 3 December 2012. Companies employing less than 50 employees **will be required** to complete the prescribed PIVOTAL training plan and report, but will be asked to provide information on participation in PIVOTAL programs and the impact of these programs. In this regard, they should complete the SASSETA Pivotal Plan Template form, which will be posted on the SASSETA website.

2. Complete in block letters
3. Ensure that the form is duly signed
4. Attach ALL of the following documents REQUIRED
 - 4.1 Certified copy of ID (not older than 3 months)
 - 4.2 Certified copy of Matric Certificate or statement of results (not older than 3 months)
 - 4.3 Proof of Registration/ Acceptance letter
 - 4.4 Attach certified ID copy and payslip of parents
 - 4.5 Attach an affidavit if parents are unemployed or self-employed


