1.5 LATE BIDS

1.5.1 Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived only one second after 11h00 or any time thereafter. Bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances. Bidders are therefore strongly advised to ensure that bids be sent allowing enough time for any unforeseen technological events that may delay the delivery of the bid via email.

1.6 FORMAT OF BIDS

1.6.1 Bidders must complete all the necessary bid documents and undertakings required in this bid document. Bidders are advised that their bid should be concise, written in plain English and simply presented.

1.6.2 Bidders are to set out their bid in the following format:

Provide a work plan of activities. In addition to providing details of the estimated number of workdays for each activity, bidders are to supply a detailed timetable that identifies when certain activities will be undertaken and over what period they will be spread. 1.7 NEGOTIATION

- 1.7.1 SASSETA has the right to enter into negotiation with a prospective service provider regarding any terms and conditions, including price(s), of a proposed contract.
- 1.7.2 SASSETA shall not be obliged to accept the lowest of any quotation, offer or bid.
- 1.7.3 SASSETA issues this bid invitation in good faith; however, it reserves the right to:
 - ❖ Cancel or delay the selection process at any time, without explanation,
 - ❖ Not to select any of the respondents to this bid invitation, without explanation,
 - ❖ Exclude certain services, without explanation.

- 1.7.4 All bidders will be informed whether they have been successful or not. A contract will only be deemed to be concluded when reduced to writing in a contract form signed by the designated responsible person of both parties.

1.8 REASONS FOR REJECTION

- 1.8.1 SASSETA shall reject a bid for the award of a contract if the recommended bidder has committed a proven corrupt or fraudulent act in competing for the particular contract.
- 1.8.2 SASSETA may disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors:
- 1.8.2.1 have abused the Supply Chain Management systems of SASSETA.
 - 1.8.2.2 have committed proven fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such systems.
 - 1.8.2.3 have failed to perform on any previous contract and the proof exists.
- 1.8.3 Such actions shall be communicated to the National Treasury.

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE

2.1 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

Safety and Security Sector Education and Training Authority (SASSETA) was established on 1 July 2005. It is one of the twenty-one Sector Education and Training Authorities (SETAs) established in terms of the Skills Development Act (Act 97 of 1998) as amended. SASSETA's licence has been renewed until 31st March 2030. SASSETA is classified as a schedule 3A Public Entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, (Act 1 of 1999, as amended). SASSETA reports to the Department of Higher Education and Training.

2.2 PURPOSE

SASSETA requires a suitable and experienced Physical Security Service Provider to provide security services from date of appointment until 30 October 2023.

2.3 SCOPE OF WORK

The service provider will be expected to deliver the following key requirements:

- Four (4) X Security Officers (Physical), Day Shift (06h00 to 18h00) Monday to Sunday (2 X strictly Grade A certificates personnel and 2 X Grade C certificates personnel). One of the Grade A Security Officers will be required to be the supervisor. The CV of this supervisor to be submitted
- Two (2) X Security Officers (Physical), Night Shift (18h00 to 06h00) Monday to Sunday (Grade C certificates personnel)
- Security Officer must have the necessary equipment for the provision of the service (e.g. Names tags, Batons, Handcuffs, Necessary communication devices, Body Armour at least at night shift, Flashlight at night shift, Pepper spray, Handheld metal detector, etc.).
- The bidder must provide security Officers that are qualified to professionally conduct:
 - Firearm discharge process (Grade A); and
 - Operate the security scanners (Grade C)
 - Operate the attendance register system (Grade C)
 - Frequent security checks (Grade C)on the stakeholders coming in - and - out of the building, and performs patrols outside the building **(copies of the Grade A and Grade C certificates to be attached for all proposed security Officer. Failure to submit these certificates will disqualify a bidder's submission)**
- The bidder must provide security Officer with professional security guard dress code as well as name tags.
- The bidder must provide 24-hour armed response for SASSETA offices for the duration of the contract. SASSETA will procure the alarm system through a separate tender.
- Bidders are expected to have an agreement with an armed response service provider before the closing date of this bid. The armed response must be able to respond within five (5) minutes of alarm triggered.
- The bidder must provide an off-site monitoring of Close Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras to be linked to the control room at the bidder's premises. (The bidder to provider the necessary wireless or internet based service to link SASSETA cameras to their control room)
- The bidder must deploy a radio-link to the SASSETA alarm system to trigger the armed response in emergencies.

- The bidder shall provide a detailed methodology (operational plan) to deliver the assignment.
- The bidder shall have the capacity to manage Employees register, Visitors register, and Assets declaration register.
- The bidder shall have Grade C Officer to deploy on site as required.

The security services to be rendered at the SASSETA Offices, which is currently at Building 2 Waterfall Corporate Campus, 74 Waterfall Drive, Waterfall City, Midrand, Johannesburg, 2090.

2.4 REQUIRED DELIVERABLES

The appointed service provider is required to deliver uninterrupted Physical Security Services from date of appointment to 30 October 2023.

The items mentioned in the scope of work to be delivered as requested.

2.5 PSIRA REQUIREMENTS

- The bidding company/ close corporation/ partnership, **must** be registered in terms of Section 20 of the PSIRA Act 2001 (Act 56 of 2001). **Valid copies of such registration must be submitted. Failure to submit the registration document will disqualify a bidder's submission.**
- The prospective service provider's rates and costs for deployed security officers must be in line with the minimum PSIRA requirements. **Costs that are not in line with the minimum PSIRA requirements will be disqualified from further evaluation.**
- Is it a condition of this tender that the successful Service Provider to be a member of a Provident fund on commencement of this contract and for their membership to be valid at date of contracting. The successful service provider will be required to be a member of a provident fund for the full tenure of the contract. A valid certificate will be requested by SASSETA before commencement of the contract. **The service provider will be required to submit a valid original or copy of the letter of good standing at any given time during for the duration of the contract.**
- All security officers in the employ of the company/ close corporation/partnership must be registered with PSIRA.
- All security officers supplied by the company/close corporation/partnership must be trained to the standards set out and regulated by PSIRA and by a training centre accredited by PSIRA. **(copies of the Grade A and C certificates to be attached for all proposed security Officer. Failure to submit these certificates will disqualify a bidder's submission)**

2.6 SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE OF THE BIDDING COMPANY AND THE TEAM MEMBERS PROPOSED ON THE ASSIGNMENT

The bidder should demonstrate the following skills and experience

- A minimum of five (5) assignments in provision of physical security Service backed by five (5) signed reference letters for each completed project on letterhead of the client.
 - ✓ Team Leader's valid PSIRA certificate (Grade A) to be submitted with the proposal. **Failure to submit a valid PSIRA certificate will disqualify a bidder's submission**

- ✓ A minimum of (15) valid PSIRA security officers' certificates to be deployed to SASSETA must be submitted as follows:
 - Six (6) grade A valid PSIRA certificate
 - Nine (9) grade C valid PSIRA certificate

The security personnel grade levels should not change for the duration of the contract. As and when there are any replacements, the grade levels are to be kept as per SASSETA requirements. **Failure to submit these valid PSIRA certificates will disqualify a bidder's submission)**

- The off-site security personnel to manage the CCTV must submit a Grade C valid PSIRA certificate and qualification in CCTV monitoring/control room. **Failure to submit this CV and valid PSIRA certificate will disqualify a bidder's submission).**

NB.: Bidders must identify who will undertake the three roles mentioned above (e.g. Team leader/team supervisor, Security personnel, offsite- security personnel for CCTV monitoring) on SBD 3.3 document. Failure to identify these roles on the proposal will lead to loss of evaluation points).

Provision of contingency plan for labour unrest and strikes on site:

When the security service is interrupted or temporarily deferred because of any labour unrest, labour disputes, civilian disorder, a local or national disaster or any other cause, the service provider must ensure the activation and implementation of contingency plans until full and normal service is restored. The service provider must ensure that the company responds to the emergency situation in less than one (1) hour.

NB: The prospective bidder is required to provide a comprehensive contingency plan to illustrate how it would ensure the safeguarding of the SASSETA facilities and employees in the event of/or any labour unrest and strikes by either security officers or employees of the SASSETA.

2.7 TIMEFRAMES FOR DELIVERY OF THE WORK

The assignment is from date of appointment to 30 October 2023.

It is a requirement of this tender that the security personnel allocated to on this contract are rotated on a quarterly basis to alleviate the familiarity behaviour to the SASSETA environment. The security personnel grade levels should not change for the duration of the contract. As and when there are any replacements, the grade levels are to be kept as per SASSETA requirements.

2.8 PRE-QUALIFICATION CRITERIA FOR PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT

SASSETA is applying pre-qualification criteria to advance level 1 EME and QSE B-BBEEE level service providers. Bidders are required to submit a valid B-BBEE certificate to substantiate their status. **Bidders who do not comply to this requirement will be automatically disqualified from the evaluation process.**

2.9 PAYMENT OF SASSETA LEVIES

Bidders are expected to be paying their Skills Development Levies to SASSETA. Bidders are required to indicate their Levy-number with this bid. It is a requirement that levies have been paid up to 29 February 2020. **Bidders who do not comply to this requirement will be automatically disqualified from the evaluation process.**

2.11 SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The proposal of the bidder is required to consist of, and demonstrate, the following:

- Team structure, roles and responsibilities;
- Signed reference letter(s) on an official letterhead from the contactable referee(s) demonstrating the services provided, period of appointment and whether the services were rendered to the satisfaction of the client.

2.12 PRICING

Service Providers are requested to provide an all-inclusive cost of this project on the Company letterhead with the following clearly indicated:

- Monthly rate per Security Guard per grade inclusive of all legislated costs applicable and VAT. **This must be in line with PSIRA rates. Rates that are below the PSIRA rates will be disqualified from evaluation.**
- Total rate per month for all security Officer deployed to SASSETA (monthly invoice amount), inclusive of VAT. **This must be in line with PSIRA rates. Rates that are below the PSIRA rates will be disqualified from evaluation.**
- Monthly cost for off-site monitoring of CCTV cameras including connectivity related costs
- Once-off armed response radio link installation costs
- Monthly subscription costs for armed response services
- Total cost of all items above from commencement of assignment from date of appointment to 30 October 2023, inclusive of VAT

Bidders to indicate possible escalation fees for the ensuing years.

Bidders are reminded that SASSETA will award the bid based on a bidder's **total project cost** and not hourly or daily rates, as per bullet above. The bidder must

ensure delivery of the project within the required timeframes stipulated in the terms of reference.

2.13 ACCOUNTABILITY AND REPORTING

The service provider will report directly to the Auxiliary Practitioner for the duration of the assignment.

2.14 MINIMUM WAGE

The prospective service provider is required to pay the security officers deployed to this contract the minimum monthly salary as prescribed by legislation and PSIRA requirements. **Costs below the minimum PSIRA rates will be disqualified from further evaluation.**

SASSETA will check salaries paid to Security Officer from time to time. Bidders must be willing to ensure a transparent payment processes for the duration of the contract.

2.15 PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT AND CONTRACT RENEWAL

This contract will be for a period from date of appointment until 30 October 2023 renewable annually/after twelve (12) months based upon SASSETA business requirements and/or satisfactory performance of the Service Provider.

2.16 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

The service provider will be contracting with SASSETA. All products and data of this project, in whatever format raw or analysed, will be the confidential information for utilisation by SASSETA. All information and documents, received from SASSETA or stakeholders, is to be kept confidential and may not be used or distributed in any format without the written approval of SASSETA. To this end, the service provider will be required to sign a confidentiality agreement within the Contract.

3 PROPOSED SELECTION CRITERIA

3.1 Compliance with minimum requirements

3.1.1 All bids duly lodged will be examined to determine compliance with bidding requirements and conditions. Bids with obvious deviations from the requirements/conditions, will be eliminated from further evaluation.

3.1.2 Conditions for selection/short listing

3.1.3 All submissions will be evaluated as follows:

3.1.3.1 Phase 1 – Mandatory items

Service Providers must:

- Submit their proposal by the closing date and time. Failure to do so will lead to automatic disqualification. **Failure to do so will lead to automatic disqualification.**
- Bidder to be a level one (1) EME and QSE and submit their valid B-BBEE certificate. **Bidders that do not comply to this requirement will be disqualified from evaluation.**
- **Bidders are to submit valid Six (6) grade A PSIRA certificate and nine (9) grade C valid PSIRA certificate. Failure to submit these certificates will disqualify a bidder's submission**
