1.5 LATE BIDS

- 1.5.1 Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived only one second after 11h00 or any time thereafter. Bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances. Bidders are therefore strongly advised to ensure that bids be sent allowing enough time for any unforeseen events that may delay the delivery of the bid.

The value of this bid is estimated <u>not to exceed</u> R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the 80/20 system shall be applicable.

Where the contract requires the successful bidder to travel to a venue different from SASSETA, the following travel and disbursement processes will be undertaken:

- Claim travel mileage costs applicable to this contract as per the Department of Transport rates
- Book only economy-class flights
- Book Group A hire cars, otherwise Group B are to be used for Service Providers outside of Gauteng.

1.8 NEGOTIATION

- 1.8.1 SASSETA has the right to enter into a negotiation with a prospective service provider regarding any terms and conditions, including price(s), of a proposed contract.
- 1.8.2 SASSETA shall not be obliged to accept the lowest of any quotation, offer or bid.
- 1.8.3 SASSETA issues this bid invitation in good faith; however, it reserves the right to:
 - Cancel or delay the selection process at any time, without explanation,
 - ❖ Not to select any of the respondents to this bid invitation, without explanation,
 - Exclude certain services, without explanation.
- 1.8.4 A contract will only be deemed to be concluded when reduced to writing in a contract form signed by the designated responsible person of both parties.

1.9 REASONS FOR REJECTION

- 1.9.1 SASSETA shall reject a bid for the award of a contract if the recommended bidder has committed a proven corrupt or fraudulent act in competing for the particular contract.
- 1.9.2 SASSETA may disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors:
 - 1.9.2.1 have abused the Supply Chain Management systems of SASSETA.
 - 1.9.2.2 have committed proven fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such systems.
 - 1.9.2.3 have failed to perform on any previous contract and the proof exists.
 - 1.9.2.4 Such actions shall be communicated to the National Treasury.

2. TERMS OF REFERENCE

2.1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 2.1.1. SASSETA was established on 1 July 2005. It is one of the twenty-one Sector Education and Training Authorities (SETAs) established in terms of the Skills Development Act (Act 97 of 1998) as amended. SASSETA's licence has been renewed until 31st March 2030. SASSETA is classified as a schedule 3A Public Entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, (Act 1 of 1999, as amended). SASSETA reports to the Department of Higher Education and Training.
- 2.1.2. The ETQA has signed Service Level Agreement (SLA) with Quality Council for Trades and Occupation (QCTO) and needs to embark on the process of appointing Subject Matter Experts (SME) facilitators/ Qualification Development Facilitator (QDFs) that will be working with the different stakeholders to develop and re-align SASSETA Qualifications.

2.2. PURPOSE

- 2.2.1. The purpose of this Request for Proposals is to appoint a pool/panel of SME/QDF's to develop new, re-align and review SASSETA legacy qualifications/ skills programmes until 31 March 2026. Currently, SASSETA legacy qualifications are expiring on the 30 June 2023 and need re-alignment to QCTO processes.
- 2.2.2. All occupational qualifications and part qualifications, including realigned pre-2009 qualifications and unit standards should comply with the Occupational Qualifications Sub Framework (OQSF) Policy and the Ministerial Determination.
- 2.2.3. Competent and experienced occupational SME facilitators/QDFs are needed for the occupational qualification development and the re-alignment process to ensure qualifications are submitted to the QCTO for SAQA registration. The appointed SME facilitators/QDFs will be allocated more than one Qualification to re-align, develop or review as per the needs of the subsectors chambers and in accordance with applications received from industry stakeholders.

2.3. SCOPE OF WORK

- 2.3.1. An SME facilitator/QDF would work in an occupational qualification system as follows:
 - 2.3.1.1. Develop, re-align and review occupational qualifications by 31 March 2026
 - 2.3.1.2. Capture and input data from stakeholders,
 - 2.3.1.3. Engage with the Development Quality Partners (DQP and AQP)
 - 2.3.1.4. Facilitate meetings with the identified Quality Partners and relevant Industry partners/experts,

2.4. REQUIRED DELIVERABLES

- 2.4.1. Scoping and Profiling
- 2.4.2. Module development process
- 2.4.3. Develop and finalise occupational curriculum document on completion of new, realigned or review of a qualification.
- 2.4.4. Developed and finalised Qualification document on completion of the

- re-alignment, development and review of the qualification.
- 2.4.5. Development of assessment specification document
- 2.4.6. Finalised Qualification Assessment Specification document (QAS Addendum)
- 2.4.7. Develop Recognition of Prior learning (RPL) and accreditation tools.
- 2.4.8. Progress report on the new, re-aligned or reviewed of legacy qualifications. Frequency of this report will depend on the qualification in question.

2.5. SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE OF THE BIDDING COMPANY AND THE TEAM MEMBER(S) PROPOSED FOR THE ASSIGNMENT

- 2.5.1. The applicants should demonstrate the following skills and experience.
 - 2.5.1.1.The Curriculum Vitae (CV) of the team leader to have three (3) years or more experience in the facilitation of QCTO Qualification Development/Re- alignment.
 - 2.5.1.2. The bidding company / Team Leader to submit three (3) or more Signed reference letters on previous/current client's letterhead with contact details confirming their satisfaction on the services rendered by the Bidding Company/Team Leader in Facilitating Occupational Qualification Development/Re-alignment.

2.6. TIMEFRAME FOR DELIVERY OF THE WORK

2.6.1. The duration of this contract for the appointment of a panel of Subject Matter Experts/ Qualification Development Facilitators will be from date of appointment to 31 March 2026.

2.7. PRICING

2.7.1. Bidder to submit SBD 3.3 pricing for development, re-alignment and review of each qualification.

2.8. ACCOUNTABILITY AND REPORTING

2.8.1. The SME/QDF will report directly to ETQA Manager.

2.9. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

2.9.1. The service provider will be contracting with SASSETA. All products and data of this project, in whatever format raw or analysed, will be confidential information for utilisation by SASSETA. All information and documents, received from SASSETA or stakeholders, is to be kept confidential and may not be used or distributed in any format without the written approval of SASSETA. To this end, the service provider will be required to sign a confidentiality agreement within the contract.

2.10. PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT

- 2.10.1. All Service Providers are to take note of the implications of POPIA act and any other data privacy Act applicable that SASSETA complies to. In compliance to the act, please be advised that the following are applicable to the treatment of vendor information:

- 2.10.4. SASSETA confirms that all submitted records will be retained in their original form and will not be altered with to preserve the quality and originality of information provided.

3. PROPOSED SELECTION CRITERIA

3.1 Compliance requirements

3.1.1 All bids duly lodged will be examined to determine compliance with bidding requirements and conditions. Bids with obvious deviations from the requirements/conditions, will be eliminated from further evaluation.

3.2 Conditions for selection/short listing

3.2.1 All submissions will be evaluated as follows:

3.2.1.1 Phase 1 – Required items, Service Providers to:

- Submit their responses/bidding documents by the closing date and time. Responses/bidding documents submitted after the date and time will be disqualified from further evaluation.
- Register the responses/bidding documents in the tender register at SASSETA reception. Responses/bidding documents not recorded on tender submission register at SASSETA reception will disqualified from further evaluation.
